DIVER FRIENDS HONOR SHIP, LOST SHIPMATES WHILE SON CARRIES ON FATHER'S LEGACY OF HONOR AND RESPECT

"The seas were calm, the water was cold and the rain was....wet." So reported Kurt REESE regarding April's Memorial Dive at the Emmons site. This year's dive was held April 6th, exactly 80 years to the day since the kamikaze attack on the Emmons.

Kurt led 12 divers who honored the memory of the 60 shipmates lost on the Emmons 80 years ago. Included among the divers was Brandi EBACH who made a beautiful wreath placed alongside the memorial plaque on the ship. Check out the photos on our website's Memorial Dives page. We anticipate Kurt will have a video of the dive to share with us at the upcoming reunion.

Chuck DeCesari, one of the leaders of the Memorial Dives the past 20 years, was missing from the solemn occasion after unexpectedly passing away last November. With Chuck having provided the transportation each year, his son, William, took the wheel this year, captaining the boat to make certain the annual memorial tradition continues.

The Emmons Association extends our heartfelt appreciation to all those involved in honoring the memory of the lost shipmates. We are grateful to Will for his desire to continue his father's legacy of honor and respect by transporting the divers to the Emmons site..

CRESSWELL BECOMES FIRST 4TH GENERATION EMMONS FAMILY MEMBER TO EARN SCHOLARSHIP

The Legacy Committee is pleased to announce James Walker CRESSWELL as this year's recipient of the \$2500 Lt. John J. Griffin, Jr. / USS *Emmons* Memorial Scholarship award.

Walker, as he is known, lives in Olive Branch, Mississippi, and will enter the University of Mississippi this fall as a freshman. He plans to enter a pre-med program majoring in English and Biology with his sights set on a career as an ophthalmologist.

William and Thomas McCONNELL, Walker's greatgreat uncles, were among the 60 shipmates who made the ultimate sacrifice aboard the *Emmons* at Okinawa, April 6, 1945. Those attending the 2023 reunion in Baltimore had the opportunity to meet Walker's grandparents, Valerie and Mack McCURRY.

With only one scholarship applicant this year, the committee found the lack of competition had no bearing on Walker earning the scholarship; after the past two years of eight and nine applicants, his essay score this year would have earned him a scholarship in both previous years. Well done Walker!

The Legacy Committee looks forward to introducing Walker and sharing his essay with everyone at the upcoming reunion.

"SAVE THE FLAG" INITIATIVE FOCUSES ON BATTLE-WORN EMMONS FLAG

Please consider contributing to help defray our cost of preserving Emmons Battle Flag, Pennant

As previously reported, the Ed (Skee) TOSTANOSKI family entrusted the Association with the battle flag and commissioning pennant retrieved from the *Emmons* the day of the kamikaze attack, April 6, 1945. It is the Association's goal to preserve and protect these historic artifacts, ensuring they will serve as a reminder of the sacrifices made by the shipmates that day.

The fragile flag and pennant, appearing tattered from weather at sea and the events of that fateful day 80 years ago, are about to receive some tender loving care from conservator Virginia WHELAN of Merion Station, PA. The Board of Directors has contracted with Virginia to help us preserve these symbols of the *Emmons'* fighting spirit.

Virginia specializes in historic needlework and fine textiles. Her clients include cultural and educational institutions, historic museums and others. She has done significant work for, among others, the Museum of the American Revolution in Philadelphia, with some of her work

including flags from the Revolutionary era, such as Washington's Headquarters flag, as well as his Valley Forge tent.

Virginia's work will include a gentle cleaning to remove 80 years of particulate soil from the surface without removing the provenance provided by the soot and staining from their time of service on the ship. A humidifying process will remove creases resulting from years of storage.

Ready for mounting, the flag and pennant will be stitched to a padded mount made of archival materials with the flag's frayed fly ends untangled and secured with thread and special conservation stitching.

Finally, the mounted flag and pennant will be encased with a black frame and Museum Acrylic, providing 99% UV protection.

We look forward to having these valuable pieces of *Emmons* history on display at future reunions and preserved for generations to come with the potential they may someday reside in a museum sharing the *Emmons* story with others.

Contributions toward the cost of Virginia's work have already been received, leaving the Association with a balance of \$2,000.

PHOTOGRAPHER DRAWN TO EMMONS SITE

Award-winning photographer Brett ELDRIDGE recently put his passion for exploring and photographing historic underwater wrecks to work for the *Emmons* Association. In June, Brett reached out to the Association with plans to build a 3D model of the *Emmons* in her final resting place.

Accompanied by Kurt REESE, unusually calm seas allowed Brett to dive on the *Emmons* five consecutive days, taking 7385 photos of the ship. Using a technique called photogrammetry, a computer program was used to turn the photos into a 3D model.

Once completed, Brett provided us with a 3' x 6' poster of the model to

have on display at reunions. Also, we're excited to share that Brett has accepted our invitation to join us at the reunion and will address the group at our Saturday banquet.



This year marks the 80th anniversary of the Battle of Okinawa and the Japanese kamikaze attack on the *Emmons*. It's been 80 years since her final day of glory that saw 60 courageous shipmates make the ultimate sacrifice in defense of their ship and their shipmates. This coming September, join us as we come together for an 80th anniversary reunion weekend to celebrate their fighting spirit while honoring the memory of the lost shipmates.

We are pleased to invite you to the 2025 *Emmons* Family Reunion September 25-28 at the Hilton Garden Inn, 4025 Wards Rd., Lynchburg, Virginia. The hotel is conveniently located one mile from Lynchburg Regional Airport (sorry, no shuttle service), in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains.

A block of guest rooms has been set aside at a group rate of \$169 plus tax, including breakfast. The rooms will be available at that rate until August 31st or until they are all gone, whichever comes first, so book early so as not to miss out on our group rate. Reservations can be cancelled up to 24 hours prior.

Our Friday outing will be a visit to the National D-Day Memorial in nearby Bedford, where we'll enjoy a guided tour and honor the lost shipmates with our annual Memorial Service. There are plenty of options for your free time Saturday, including Thomas Jefferson's Poplar Forest retreat, the American Civil War Museum and the Appomattox Court House, site of General Robert E. Lee's surrender to General Ulysses S. Grant, ending the Civil War. And, of course, there's always shopping or just relaxing at the hotel.

And, as always, Saturday evening's banquet program will provide us the opportunity to meet and hear from our 2025 Lt. Griffin/Emmons Memorial Scholarship recipients.
