

EMMONS FAMILY HEADED TO PORTSMOUTH, NH, AND HISTORIC SHIPYARD FOR SEPTEMBER REUNION

Facilities of one of our country's oldest and most historic Naval sites — the Portsmouth (NH) Naval Shipyard — will anchor activities for the 2016 Emmons Association Reunion in September.

Dates of the annual gathering are September 22-25, with our hospitality head-quarters at the Holiday Inn, Portsmouth, NH, located just off Interstate 95.

The Naval Shipyard was founded in pre-Revolutionary days when it built ships for His Majesty, the King. It was established as a United States facility by President John Adams and continued building US sailing vessels through the 1800's.

Became Submarine Center

Early in the last century, the Shipyard began construction of submarines and remained the pre-eminent builder of the undersea craft through both World Wars and into the nuclear age. The Yard is now charged with modernization and repair of our submarine fleet.

Hotel and registration information packets have already been mailed. Reunion activities will get underway Thursday with registration and greeting of arrivals in our hospitality room at the hotel.

The Shipyard's Office of Public Affairs has been most helpful in handling all arrangements for our Friday visit to the Yard. Our traditional Memorial Service will be in the Thresher Chapel, followed by a tour of the Shipyard and lunch at the Tirante Tavern Restaurant.

Association Programs

Friday afternoon we will gather in the hospitality room for an information session and update on recent activities among our friends at Okinawa and programs of the Legacy Committee. Socializing will continue in the evening at a buffet dinner hosted by the Association.

President Armand JOLLY will preside at the annual Crew/Association meeting Saturday morning.

Activities will climax Saturday night at the Reunion Banquet with the presentation of the John J. Griffin/USS Emmons 2016 Scholarship awards.

Everyone is reminded to make hotel reservations directly with the hotel by August 31 to receive our group rate.

OKINAWA CHAPTER OF EMMONS ASSOCIATION CARRIES OUT 71ST ANNIVERSARY MEMORIAL DIVE

For the second consecutive year, the Far Eastern weatherman smiled favorably and our Okinawa Emmons friends were able to carry out the 71st anniversary Memorial Dive on the planned date, April 2. Reporting in an email the next day, Kurt REESE said, "We met at Chuck's (DECESARI's) port at 0630 to get his boat in the water and start setting up gear. It was a nice day with a

bit of haze in the air – anything beats wind and rain, so we were pleased with what we had. The forecast called for two-foot seas at six-seconds – we're usually good with anything three-feet or less, as long as they're far enough apart.

DIVER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM HONORS EMMONS LEGACY; FOCUSES ON EMMONS HISTORY AND RESPECT FOR WRECK

Retired Naval Aviator and Okinawa scuba diving instructor, Kevin KING, wrote notifying us of a new diving specialty allowing divers to get certified in diving on the USS Emmons. He explained the goal of this specialty would be three-fold:

- 1) to promote the historical importance and impact of the USS Emmons and the bravery and suffering of her crew.
- 2) to educate divers on specifics of the wreck during guided tours, em-

phasizing wreck preservation and respect.

3) to provide \$50 of every certification tuition directly to the USS Emmons Association.

Kevin recently notified us that the first six certifications have been awarded, resulting in a \$350 contribution to the Lt. John J. Griffin/USS Emmons Memorial Scholarship Fund. The Association is grateful for the respect and honor bestowed on the Emmons by

Kevin and we congratulate him on what we expect to be a successful program.

He concluded by stating, "I consider it an honor to promote your Association and the role that the USS Emmons played so long ago in 1945. I would like to help ensure that the younger generations in our military today know their history and heritage of yesteryear."

REPORT ON EMMONS DETERIORATION

In a follow-up to his account of the Anniversary Dive, Kurt REESE passed along observations of continuing deterioration of the **Emmons**.

"I noticed two major differences since my last time out: The hole in the bow has grown considerably, and a piece of the ship structure that had been covering the entrance to the wardroom has broken free, leaving the entrance completely exposed.

"I think the bow is taking the lead in its deterioration. If the current is running right, it flows through the hole in the port bow, pushing pieces out of the way. The collapse hasn't reached open hatches leading to the upper handling room of Gun One and the Chief's Quarters, but it's creeping ever closer.

"The wardroom hatch had earlier been partially blocked by a semicircular piece of steel that I think was from one of the 20mm. gun tubs. It has slid down the starboard side, coming to rest where it hit the sand.

"I plan to get out to the Emmons again soon and document her condition as fully as possible."
