

## ASSOCIATION ENTRUSTED WITH **EMMONS' STEAMING COLORS**

With the abandon ship order given as he continued to assist his injured shipmates, TOSTANOSKI (Skee) somehow retrieved the ship's 'steaming colors,' the term used to identify the U.S. Flag flown while under way at sea.

57 years later, Skee proudly displayed the colors at a 2002 memorial service for the lost shipmates held above the site of the ship's sinking, providing a solemn feeling of the ship's presence. Shipmates in attendance with him were Bob CHAROUX and Joe WOODNICK.

With Skee having passed away several years ago, sons John and Ed Jr., who also attended that ceremony, recently informed the Emmons Association that they wish to honor their father's intention to place the flag

## MEMORIAL PLAQUE FINDS A NEW HOME

As previously reported, the memorial plaque placed on the *Emmons* wreck in 2003 at the direction of the shipmates was replaced in 2020 with an exact replica to remove it from the dangers of the rapidly deteriorating ship.

We're pleased to report the original plaque continues to share the Emmons story as it is now on loan in its own place of honor, displayed at Tsunami Scuba, an Okinawa dive shop frequented by those who dive on the Emmons.

Placed in its new home by Matt LEWIS, with an assist from Kurt REESE, in addition to making others aware of the sacrifice of the lost shipmates, it will now help promote Matt's revival of the Emmons specialty dive certification

program started in 2016 by Kevin KING, who

has since returned to the states.

The certification program promotes the I historical importance and impact of the *Em*mons and the bravery and sacrifices of her crew, and educates divers on specifics of the wreck during guided tours, emphasizing preservation and respect for the wreck site. A portion of the fee goes to support the scholarship program.

We thank Matt for seeing that the plaque continues to share the Emmons story and wish him the best as he moves forward with the certification program.

(MISSION Continued from page 1) retrieved the plaques, removed the marine growth, and returned them to the ship.

Sounds like a simple operation, right? Think again.

To begin with, the plaques and stainless steel backing weigh in excess of 100 lbs., requiring planning, teamwork and patience to accomplish the task.

The first diver descends with bolt cutters to cut the chains that secure the plagues to the ship. The second diver holds the plaques upright allowing a third diver to secure a harness around the plaques (Kurt had the harness custom made for the Emmons).

Lift bags tied to the harness are then inflated to neutral buoyancy. As they slowly ascend with the plaques, they maintain a constant state of neutral buoyancy by dumping the expanding air until reaching the surface.

Once back to port, the plagues are soaked in 50/50 vinegar/and water over several days to kill off any marine growth.


To return the plaques, they are lowered from Chuck's boat to a depth of about 100 feet where attached lift bags are inflated to achieve neutral buoyancy, allowing the divers to maneuver them in place above the ship where the air is dumped as they gently lower the plagues to the hull.

With that, the plaques are once again back in place serving the purpose intended by the survivors years ago.....honoring the memory of their lost shipmates and allowing all who visit the site to fully understand the sacrifices made that fateful day, April 6, 1945.

## Now HEAR This!

In attendance at our 2023 reunion were U.S. Army Major Robert and Dawn BOURGEAU who had recently moved back to the states from Okinawa. At the reunion, we learned the Soldier's Medal had been awarded to Major BOURGEAU recognizing his heroism in rescuing a man and young girl from severe riptides at a popular snorkeling spot in Okinawa.

What we didn't know at the time was the connection BOURGEAU, a dive instructor, had with one of our Emmons family members. At the rescue site, he had with him two students, Nathan FEURA, greatgrandnephew of shipmate GOCELLA, and his army wife, Capt. Neda OTHMAN. They were there planning to make deepwater dives with their instructor. In fact, Nathan participated in the rescue.

Nathan, a student at Western Governors University, is working toward his Masters in Data Analytics. His Joe great-granduncle, GOCELLA, gave his life aboard the Emmons at
