

This issue of the Newsletter is dedicated in memory of President Armand J. Jolly

Armand Jolly, president of the USS Emmons Association, died peacefully December 26, 2020, at the age of 98. A resident of Pomfret Center, CT, he recovered remarkably well from a stroke in 2019, allowing him to attend the Gettysburg reunion. At the time of his death he was recovering from a second stroke.

Armand served aboard the Emmons as a Gunner's Mate from September, 1942, to the Okinawa attack ships among generations of the Emin April, 1945.

PLANS MOVE FORWARD FOR SEPTEMBER ANNAPOLIS REUNION

Kurt REESE reported that a rare break in the weather allowed the 76th Anniversary Memorial Dive to take place April 3rd. Chuck DeCESARI once again generously donated the use of his boat as he, Kurt and eight others ventured out to honor the fallen *Emmons* sailors at the *Emmons* site.

Those who participated, as well as preliminary photos provided by Kurt and Brandi Ebach, can be viewed on our website's Memorial Dive page. And as in the past, Kurt has promised a video documenting the dive will be provided for the reunion. Kurt also informs us the divers contributed \$1000 to our

We recently heard from Dave FRAN-CIS, who was able to help us identify his father, Lt.(jg) Herbert K. FRANCIS, as one of the sailors in our photo archives. Herbert transferred off the *Emmons* in November, 1944, to the USS *Hugh Purvis* DD-709.

Dave also provided a copy of the November, 1944, Officer Report of Changes that helped us identify service dates we were missing for some officers.

And speaking of service dates, shipmate Lt. Earl BLAKE's granddaughter, Kristin, came across our website while researching her grandfather's service and noticed our database of shipmates was missing Earl's service dates, which she proudly provided.

In a follow-up email, Kristin's father, Alan BLAKE, told of his father attending basic training at Notre Dame and later reporting to the Emmons on September 3, 1942, and of his father's sharing of Navy stories with him growing up.

Both Kristin and Alan also shared several photos including snapshots of pre-invasion Omaha Beach, pollywog/shellback crossing the equator ritual and others that helped us put names to other previously unidentified shipmates. All these photos are included in our website's photo archive.

Mike DEVERS, son of shipmate John Devers, shared with us some photos of his father's Shellback and Bluenose certificates he recently came across.

The Shellback and Bluenose ceremonies are time-honored Navy traditions that take place when a ship crosses the equator and arctic circle, respectively.

The equator ritual has King Neptune come aboard the ship to oversee a sailor's transformation from slimy Pollywog, who hasn't crossed the equator, to trusty Shellback, also called a Son of Neptune. It was a way for sailors to be tested for their seaworthiness.

For the Arctic Circle, there's also a line-crossing ceremony where a sailor becomes a certified Bluenose.

Both ceremonies provide the transformed sailor with a certificate documenting the occasion. The photos of the certificates can be seen in our website's photo archive.
