OUR SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS - WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Since its inception, the Lt. John J. Griffin, Jr./USS *Emmons* Scholarship Program has awarded scholarships totaling \$41,750 to *Emmons* Family students.

Just as important, the essays submitted by each and every one of the 33 applicants over that time have exhibited sincere honor and respect for the service of the *Emmons* shipmates and the sacrifices of the 60 men who gave their lives for our country at Okinawa, April 6, 1945.

Of those 33 applicants, 14 were awarded scholarships based on their letters of reference, grade transcripts and essays submitted. After 13 years, the Legacy Committee felt it's time to check in with them to see what they've been up to and to learn how this scholarship has helped them achieve their goals and bring them to where they are today.

Over the next several newsletters, we will update you on just that. In this issue, we begin with two prior recipients below. As you'll see, we all have reason to be proud to call them 'Emmons Family.'

Jennifer Tucci - 2010 recipient; granddaughter of Paul F. Dodd WT1c.

After earning her BS in Animal Science and Pathobiology from the University of Connecticut, Jen went on to earn her Doctor of Veterinary Medicine from the University of Florida in 2014. Following her internship in NJ, she settled in Colorado where she started her own veterinary business in the Denver area. Her love of the outdoors allows her to enjoy hiking and mountain biking on weekends.

Her business, Balanced Animal Wellness, specializes in acupuncture, chiropractic care and physical therapy for dogs and cats. Her work focuses on improving function and quality of life for aging pets with arthritis or degenerative conditions, relief of chronic pain, and rehab for pets after surgery.

"The scholarship was a blessing for me to help subsidize my higher education. The acupuncture, chiropractic and physical therapy training has all been additional time and financial commitment after the 4 year doctorate degree. But more than the financial help, being awarded an Emmons scholarship meant a great deal to me, because I know my grandfather was extremely proud of me and my achievements."

Asked if she had any words of encouragement for those students thinking of applying for the Griffin/Emmons Scholarship, Jen replied, "I would definitely encourage students to apply for the Emmons Scholarship. By awarding me the scholarship, I felt like the committee was welcoming me into the Emmons family."

Eileen Pollina - 2012, 2013 & 2014 recipient; grand-daughter of James Korney WT3c.

Following her graduation from Roger Williams University with a graphics design communications degree, Eileen worked in a variety of graphic design roles in Massachusetts and Rhode Island. Having gained experience, she began her own greeting card company.

In 2020, Eileen married her college sweetheart, Brett Pollina. They currently live in Newport, RI.

Today, she owns her own stationery and gift store, Eileen on Thames, located there in Newport. You can see her work on her website at **www.eileengraphics.com**. Eileen says her plans going forward are to expand her business throughout New England and beyond, buy a home with Brett, hopefully on Aquidneck Island, and start a family.

"To me, the scholarship award meant discovering more about my family history and sharing a bond with my grandfather, Jim. Through the experience, I gained a better understanding and further respect for the sacrifices made by the men aboard the USS Emmons and all who served during WWII. The Emmons legacy continues to shape future generations in this way, and for that I am extremely grateful."

Asked of her experience with the scholarship program, Eileen stated, "Receiving this award benefited me greatly and relieved my family of some of the financial burden of sending me to a four year private college....We miss my grandfather deeply, but knowing that the memory of him and his crew lives on through this scholarship is comforting."
